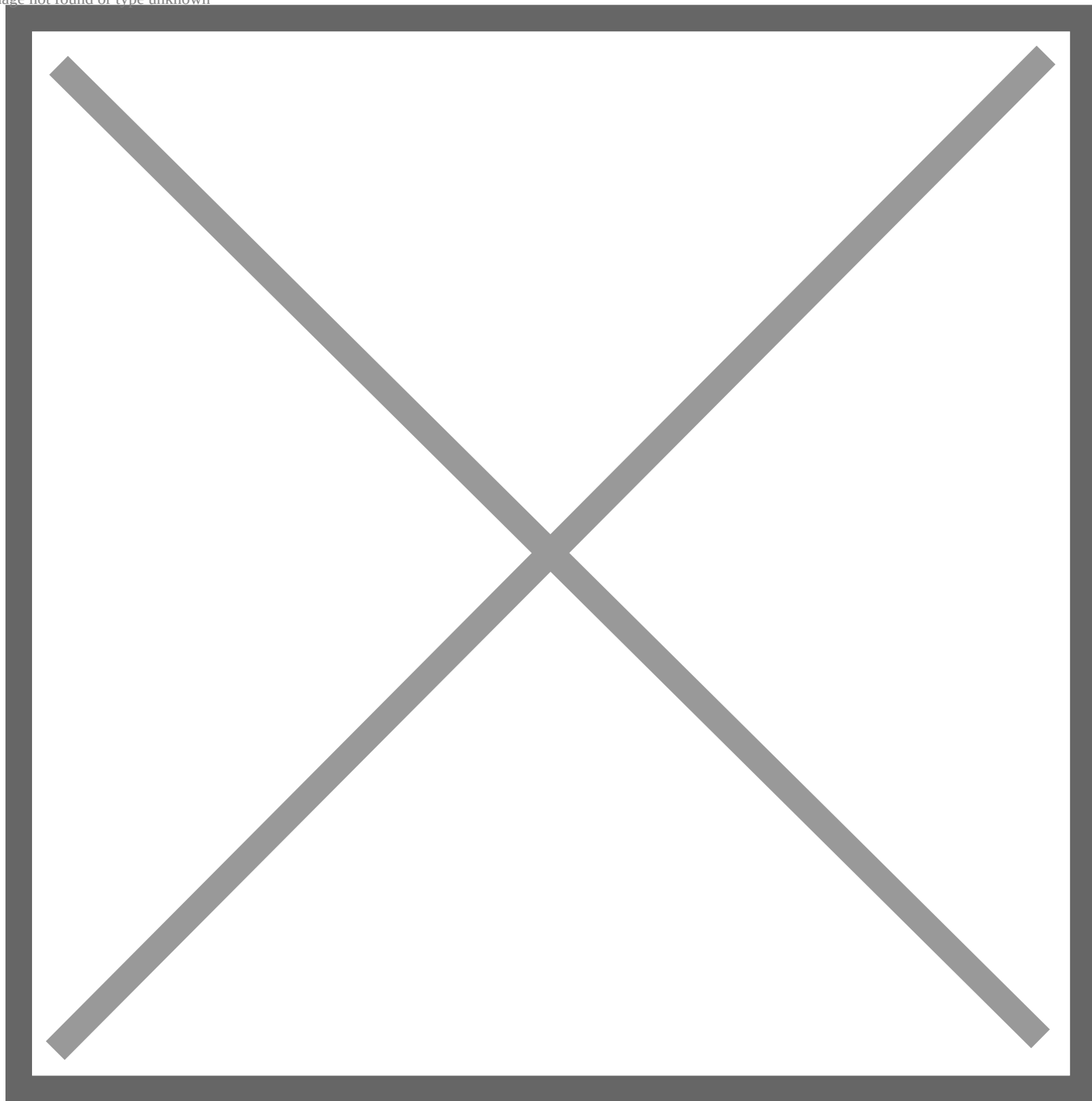


First-Ever Grand Highlander will Have Adults Calling Dibs on Third Row Seats
